

Carole Lane



Sister Carole Lane began her UBC National Job Corps
Training Fund career in 1991 as an instructor at Timber Lake,
after many productive years as a carpenter in the Portland
area. During her nine years working directly with Job Corps
students, Carole developed a great deal of wisdom and several
"hacks" for making future UBC carpenters out of sometimes
reluctant learners. When she was hired as Field Coordinator
in 2000, this knowledge was something she shared generously
with *her* instructors over the next twenty years.

Instructor Shaun Cushman at Wolf Creek says, "When I was hired to become an instructor, I got a fuller view of how knowledgeable Carole was in both the trade and the workings of the programs she supervised. Carole could provide ways to reach our students and pass on the skills that were needed at the time with ease, and in a way the students could understand." As a leader, Carole enjoyed enormous respect from peers, program partners, Job Corps center staff and students, and those whom she supervised. Instructor Kevin Hitchcock at Fort Simcoe speaks with admiration of Carole's "high-level common sense." As a boss, she was "insightful, tough, and dedicated," says Dan Williamson, Field Coordinator. The "secret ingredient," though, is *heart*. And to a person, those who have had the privilege of working for and with Carole speak of her deep caring and commitment. Lead instructor Rich Evoniuk at Wolf Creek says that Carole's emotions run deep, and she cared enormously for her instructors – they were family. Carole was always available for her instructors; Lead Instructor Bill Norwill at Curlew speaks of how Carole taught him "center diplomacy" and says Carole was "the kind

of boss I felt I could always call no matter what kind of issues I was having." His teaching partner, Dan Dobson, agrees: "she was always there to give us advice when we needed it."Of course, Carole knew that all work and no play was no way to live, so while she was traveling for program visits, she enjoyed getting to know her instructors and their families. Lead Instructor Tony Gulley at Fort Simcoe recalls, "My wife and I would always pick Carole up at her hotel and go out to dinner on her visits here." He adds, "Carole is one of the strongest, smartest, and most loving people I have ever met – what a beautiful human being!"And of course, anyone who has spent even a few minutes with Carole can tell you about her love of all things automotive. Well, all the fast things, anyway. Lead Instructor Mark Sorlien at Columbia Basin says he and Carole were talking about pickup trucks (if you can imagine) and she asked him, "Do you know what rolling coal means?" (You can ask her yourselves about that!) There is an abundance of testimony about Carole's twin loves of fun and wheels, well captured in Bill Norwill's wistful comment "I miss her great sense of humor and her admiration for fine automobiles."Lead Instructor at Angell, Elizabeth "Tissi" Snelson, credits Carole as being her greatest mentor and sums up Carole's legacy well: "When she would walk into my office, I felt inspired to straighten up my back, stand a little taller – not because I had to, but because I wanted to let her know that the time she spent in the field 'trailblazing' was noted and appreciated. Carole is, and will always be, a calm and powerful warrior for the UBC, the Sisters in the Brotherhood, and the UBC Job Corps."
